Geni – online talent management system



Whilst on the scheme you'll have access to a variety of useful resources through Geni, our online talent management system. You'll use Geni for lots of things including recording your annual leave, tracking your progress against scheme competencies, documenting your Performance Reviews with your managers and accessing policies, procedures and useful guidance documents.

You'll receive access to Geni in the next month or so. An email will be sent to the email address you provided on your application. You'll be asked to populate your profile with a short bio and profile picture, this will be really helpful for us to get to know you better.

We'll also set you up with an nhs.net email address, in time we'll ask you to replace your personal email address in Geni with this address instead so we have one address to contact you.

We'll tell you more about Geni and your nhs.net account in July.

#### Team GMTS

Over the summer you'll likely have contact from different teams that support GMTS including Resourcing, NHS Business Services Authority and Local Leadership Academy colleagues.

## Scheme structure and education dates

This alongside <u>your education dates here</u> will help you to see how you'll spend your time on the Scheme and how each of the Scheme elements fall across your 2/2.5 years.

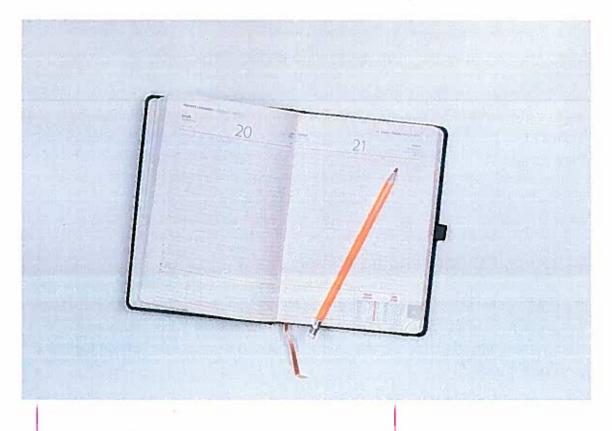
Please be aware annual leave requests across GMTS Scheme commitments including education, Experiential Learning, exams/resit exam periods etc will not be approved. Some of you have been in touch to inform us about pre-booked leave, we will be reaching out to you soon to advise on any that clash with Scheme commitments that cannot be changed.

Your education dates will be helpful to discuss with your managers when you get to meet them over the summer. We recgonise they may provoke questions, feel free to ask these in upcoming Pathmotion chats.

The cohorts/groups for the Elizabeth Garrett Anderson Programme and Experiential Learning have not yet been allocated, and therefore you will need to keep all of the dates on the document flexible please. When you're advised of your specific groups you'll be able to release some dates.

We'll provide you with more information on your education, study days and academic progression in your next GradMail and there will also be an opportunity to speak to your education provider via Pathmotion in mid-end July.

# Your placement information

Scheme representatives and your Local Leadership Academies are working hard to place you in the best organisations. Decisions are made in partnership with local NHS managers who share the aim of allocating trainees to placements which they believe will provide the best development opportunities for you.

Towards the end of June you will be provided with your allocated placement organisation(s).

The address you provided on your application will be used in considering placement allocations. If you change this address before your start date of 5 September 2019, please email both grad.hrqueries@nhsbsa.nhs.uk and nhsgrads.trac@hee.nhs.uk as soon as possible.

It's important you make an effort to visit your first placement organisation over the summer at a mutually convenient time.

In preparation for your visit we'd suggest you:

### Research the organisation

Look at their website, search for them in the news and read any recent board papers or business plans which are publicly available. Get a brief understanding of the issues they're currently facing and get an idea of the things you'd be interested in seeing when you start there.

### Speak to your buddy

A buddy will be allocated to you whilst you are on the scheme. Your buddy will usually be a trainee in their second year from the previous intake. You should hear from them in July. Your buddy can advise you on how to approach your visit and whether or not they're within the same organisation as you, they'll be able to offer some useful insights.
